MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Committee on Resolutions Report

- 1. The Committee on Resolutions convened at 10:45 a.m., 11 August 2025, in Carson Meeting Rooms 3 and 4 of the Grand Sierra Resort in Reno, Nevada. There were 55 voting members present, and 37 states and territories represented. The committee adjourned at 3:40 p.m. on 13 August 2025.
- 2. The Committee considered 14 resolution proposals submitted by member states and territories in accordance with the EANGUS By-Laws. Of these 14 proposals, eight were recommended for adoption. Further, the Committee has proposed and recommended one additional resolution for separate consideration, for a total of nine proposals recommended for adoption and six not recommended.
- 3. As provided by the EANGUS By-Laws, only those resolution proposals that the Committee recommends for adoption will be reported to the Conference. Those proposals not recommended by the Committee are attached as a written enclosure to this report (Article VIII, Section 3, Standing Committees).
- 4. To eliminate any confusion, the proposal numbers listed as recommended for adoption by the Committee coincide with the original Resolution Proposals Report electronically distributed to the membership prior to the Conference. They have *not* yet been renumbered. Upon adoption by the delegates to the Conference, they will be renumbered in sequence as EANGUS Standing Resolutions. A full, updated report of 2025 Resolution Proposals, including committee recommendations and approved amendments, is attached to this report.
- 5. For clarity of process, I will next move to adopt all but the final recommended proposal as a block. I will list only the proposal number. Specific titles will not be read but are listed in the written report filed with the Secretary. If any delegate disagrees with the proposed recommendations of the Committee, they should be prepared to identify the specific resolution and request further discussion or make a motion to withdraw the resolution from the block after the motion to adopt has been made. Lastly, as the motions that follow come from the Committee, they require no second.

6. By direction of the Committee, I move for the adoption of the following resolution proposals, en bloc, as EANGUS Standing Resolutions:

- 7. The Committee has submitted and recommended one final resolution proposal, and has asked that it be read in full for consideration of the membership. On behalf of the Committee, I move for the adoption of Resolution Proposal 25-18D, titled Commendation of the Nevada Enlisted Association and Auxiliary, the State of Nevada, and the City of Reno. As reads:
- a. Business Case: The 54th Annual Conference of the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States met at the Grand Sierra Resort in Reno, Nevada, from August 11 to 14, 2025. The Enlisted Association of Nevada (NVEANGUS) and its Auxiliary, in partnership with the State of Nevada and the City of Reno, warmly welcomed their fellow National Guard members and retirees, their spouses, and guests. The unwavering commitment and hard work of the Reno Conference Committee significantly enhanced the Annual Conference experience, making it both highly successful and memorable.
- b. Recommendation: The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States extends its heartfelt appreciation and commendation to the Enlisted Association of Nevada and its Auxiliary, the State of Nevada, and the City of Reno for their exceptional support and hospitality.
